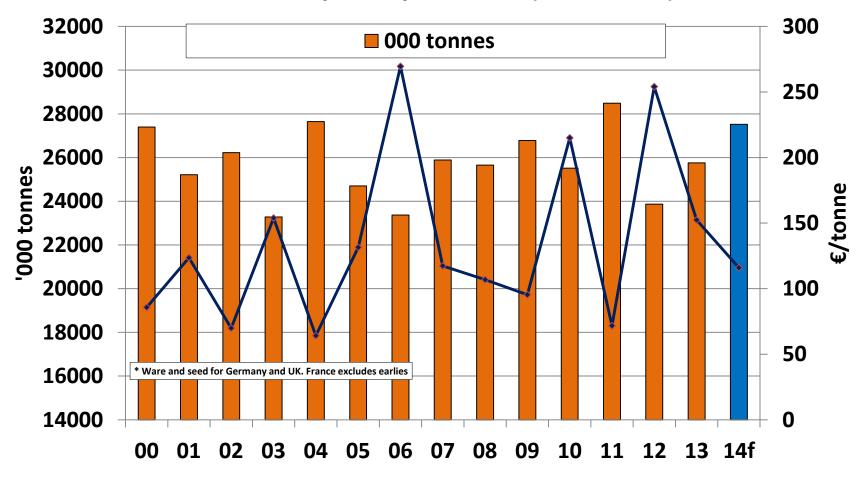

The 2014 European harvest

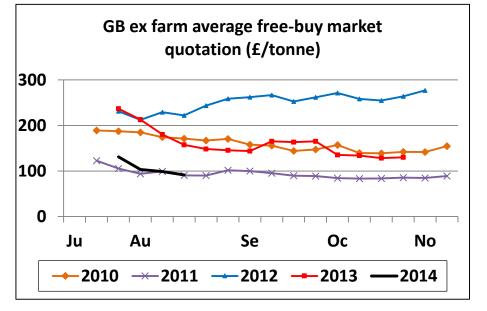

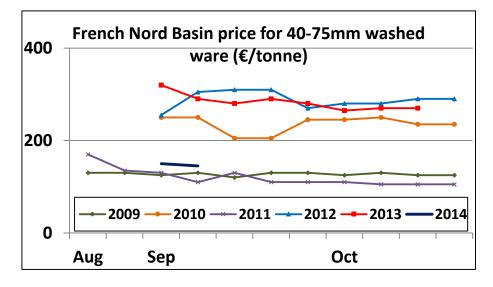


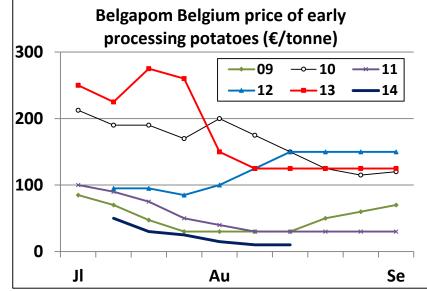

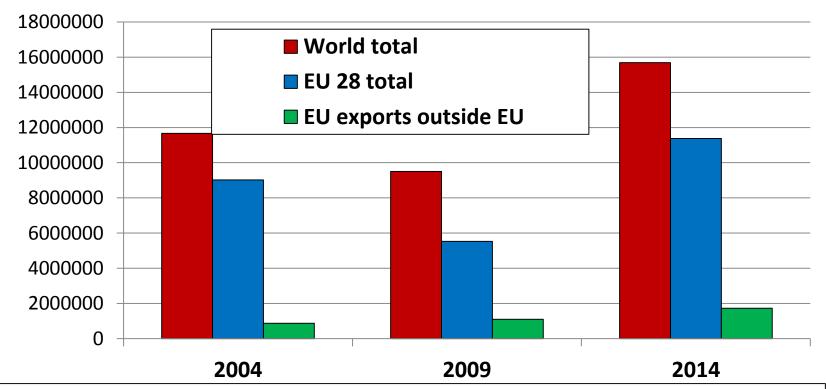

Growing trade. World and EU total potato and product exports in tonnes

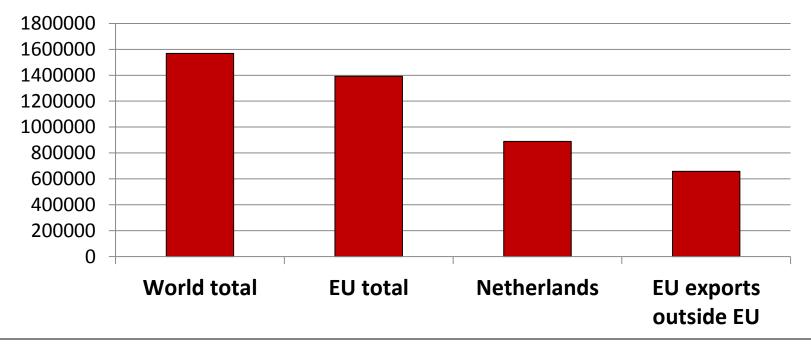


EU potato exports accounted for 72.5% of world trade in year to April 2014 and increased by 26% between 2004 and 2014. EU exports outside the EU accounted for 15% of EU trade in 2014 and were 97.5% up on 2004

EU potato exports accounted for 72.5% of world trade by value in year to 2014 and increased by 76% between 2004 and 2014. EU exports outside the EU were 20% of the total in 2014 and up 410% on the 2004 figure

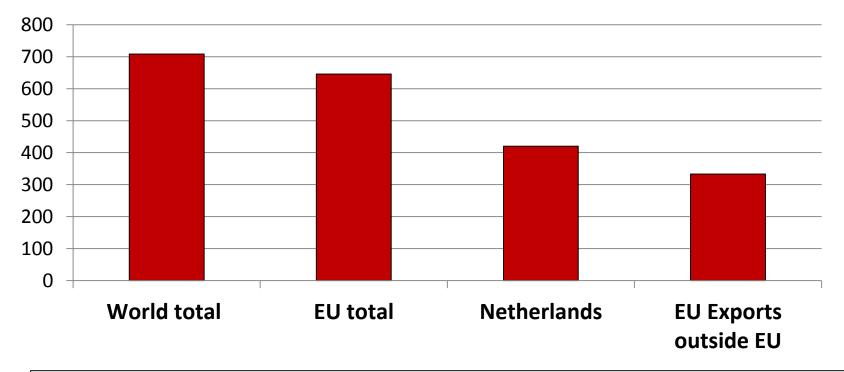
World and EU potato seed exports in tonnes in year to April 2014



The EU accounts for 89% of world seed exports by value with 42% of sales outside the EU. The Netherlands accounts for 57% of world trade



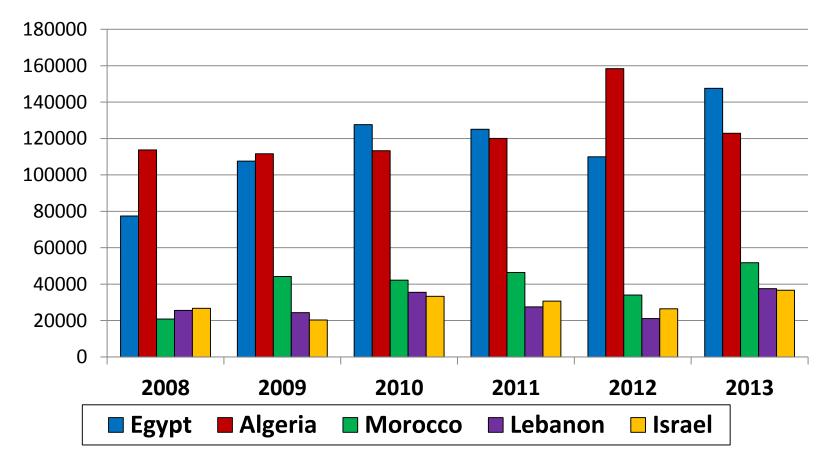
World and EU seed exports in € million in year to April 2014



The EU accounts for 91% of world seed exports by volume with 51.5% of EU sales outside the EU. The Netherlands accounts for 59% of world trade.

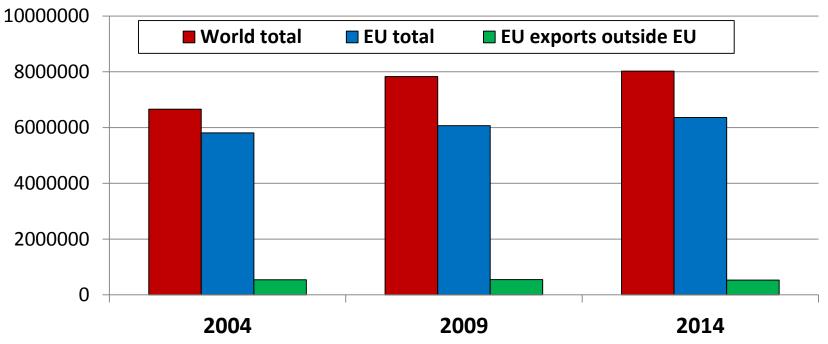


Main external buyers of EU seed potatoes in tonnes





World and EU ware potato exports in tonnes in year to April

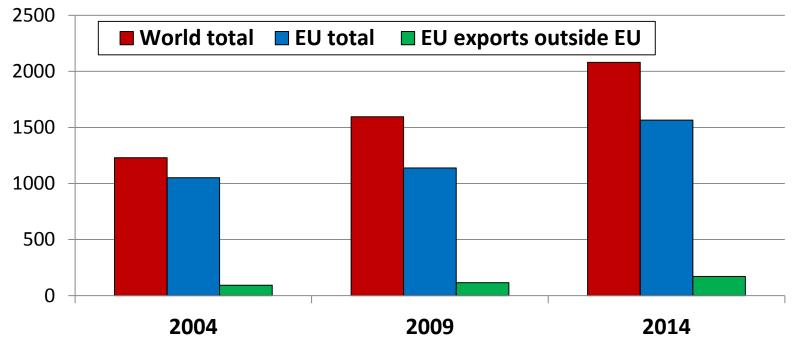


The EU accounts for 79% of world

ware exports by volume with trade up 9.5%

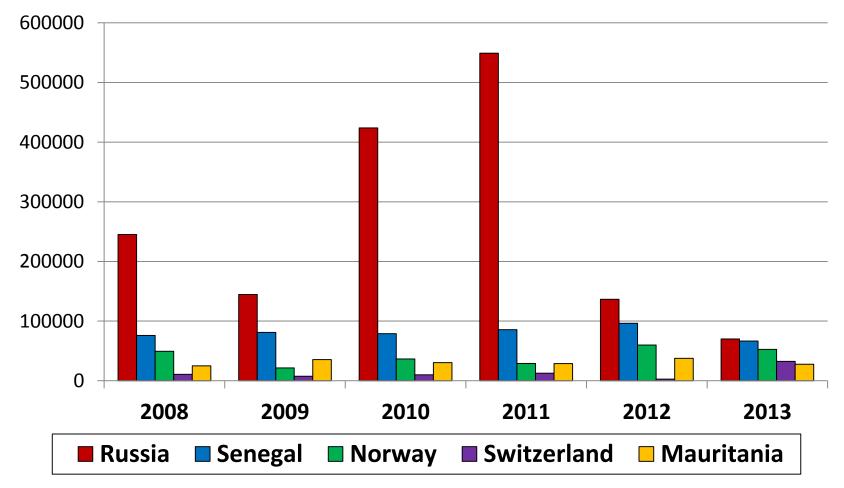

World and EU ware potato exports in € million in year to April

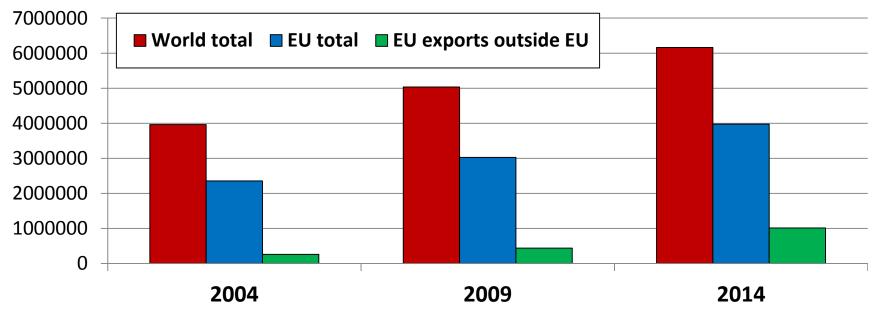


The EU accounts for 75% of world ware exports by value with trade up 49% since 2004 and 11% of EU sales outside the EU.

Main external buyers of EU ware potatoes in tonnes

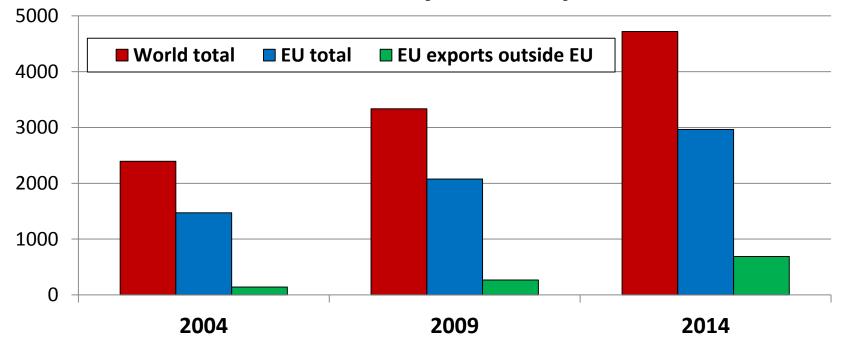


World and EU fry exports in tonnes in year to April



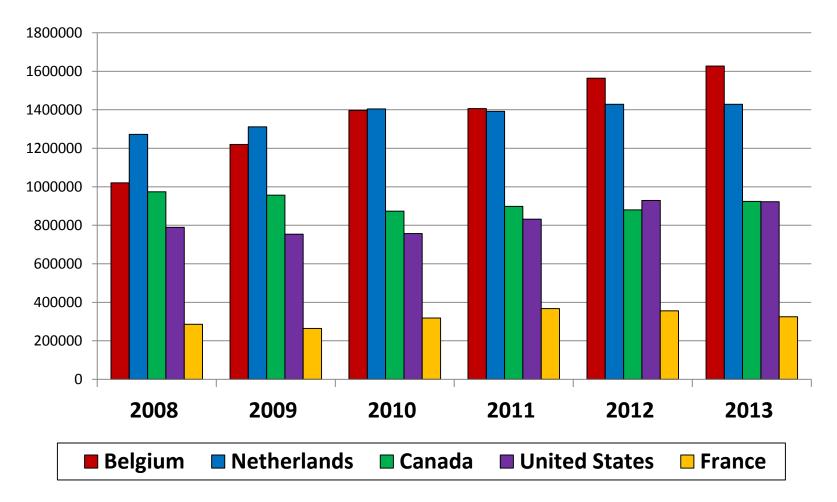
The EU accounts for 64.5% of world fry exports by volume with trade up 69% since 2004 and 25% of EU sales outside the EU, up from 11% in 2004.

World and EU fry exports in € million in year to April

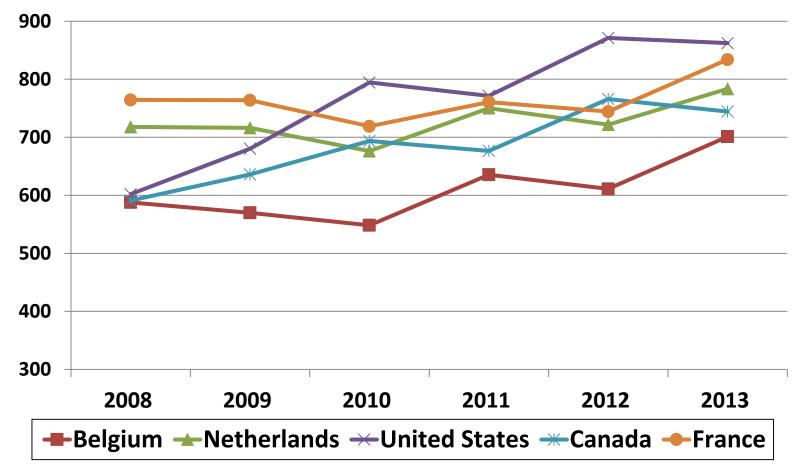


The EU accounts for 63% of world fry exports by value with trade up 102% since 2004 and 23% of EU sales outside the EU, up from 9% in 2004.

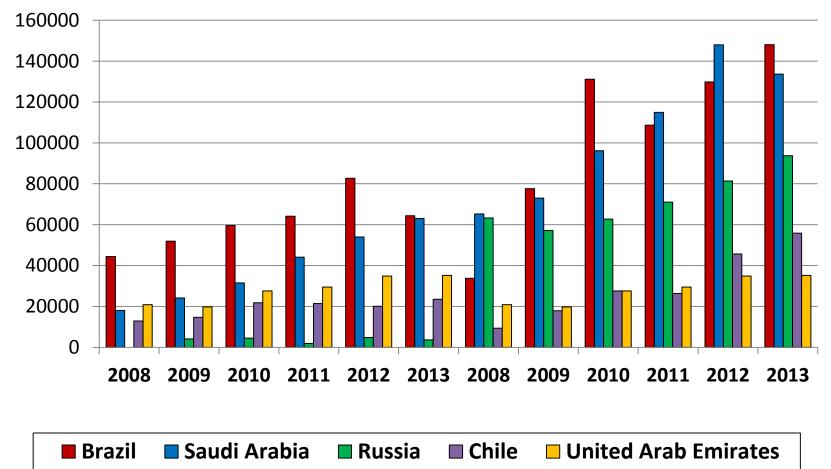
World fry exports 2008-13 in tonnes

Trade bans and restrictions

Aside from the latest ban on Russian imports, the last two years have seen a number of significant trade bans and restrictions:

- Russia's ban on ware imports from July 2013 due to phytosanitary concerns: in year to July 2013 EU exported 80,000 tonnes of ware to Russia worth €30 million. In year to July 2011 800,000 tonne were exported worth €270 million. In year to April 2014 Russia imported 135,000 tonne of EU potatoes and potato products worth €95 million. Total potato and potato product imports were only worth €775,000.
- In July 2013 South Africa imposed a 61% duty on imported fries to protect its own industry. From July 2014 a two year programme of duty at 41% and 21% was introduced. In the year to July 2013 the EU exported 32,000 tonnes to South Africa worth €22.4 million.
- In 2012 Brazil banned Argentine fry imports for three months which benefitted European exporters.
- Australian and New Zealand potato industry has complained about imports of low priced EU fries

Conclusions

- The value of EU potato and potato exports has increased by 72% in the last ten 10 years. The value of fry sales has doubled in that time
- The value of EU potato sales outside the EU has increased by 75%
- Trade bans and restrictions pose a risk for the EU potato industry
- The greatest growth in potato consumption will be outside the EU – Africa, India and parts of Asia
